Knowing Your Rights

- American's with Disabilities Act: adopted in 1992, revised in 2010.
- Air Carriers Access Act (14 CFR 382): adopted in 1986, revised in 2008
 - Compliance is required of <u>all</u> carriers flying into and out of the United States. Domestic and International carriers are required to comply under an amendment called Air 21.

- Be prepared with suggested solutions to any obstacles
- Book as early as possible



Packing for your Trip

- Medications & personal care supplies
- Bathroom or transfer equipment
- List of the following in case of emergency:
 - Physicians' Names, Numbers, & Addresses
 - Medications
 - Medical Diagnoses
 - Insurance Information





Airport Security

- TSA provides ongoing training with their security screeners on appropriate screening techniques for people with different types of disabilities
- Because many disabilities are not visual, all TSA officers are required to ask any passenger in a wheelchair "are you able to stand, is your party able to assist you with standing or lifting and/or are you able to use upper body strength to lift yourself?" (to check the cushion).
- TSA CARES can be contacted about 72 hours before travel at 1-855-787-2227 to have a TSA Passenger Support Specialist escort you through the security checkpoint so TSA can ensure you will be provided with the appropriate level of assistance you need.



Air Travel Tips

- For Domestic flights arrive at least 1.5 2 hours prior to departure and For International Flights arrive at least 2.5 -3 hours in advance of your flight. You must be at the gate 15 minutes prior to boarding for domestic flights and 45 minutes prior to the boarding of any international flight.
- Do **NOT** check your chair as baggage.
- Confirm seating and transportation/boarding assistance needed. Transfers always occur at the door of the aircraft.
- Secure all removable parts of wheelchair.
- For power wheelchair- laminate instructions on the wheelchair for how to disengage the motor and secure your drive system.


Tips for on board the airplane:

- Sit on wheelchair cushion in the airplane
 - Air vs gel cushion
- Take something along if you will need it to put under your feet so your knees are at a 90° angle
- Chest strap?
- Know how you will do your weight shifts
- Option for personal aisle chair

- Public transit
- Regional transportation:
 - Amtrack offers discount fares for travelers w/ disabilities
 - Grey Hound offers 50% discount for personal care attendant traveling with traveler w/ disability

Hotel Tips

- Handicap vs. wheelchair accessible
- Bedroom accessibility
 - Bed height
 - Removing box spring or box frame from underneath
 - Learn to do dependent slide board if possible to eliminate need to travel with hoyer
 - Extra furniture
 - Ask for pictures of the room
 - Evacuation plan?


